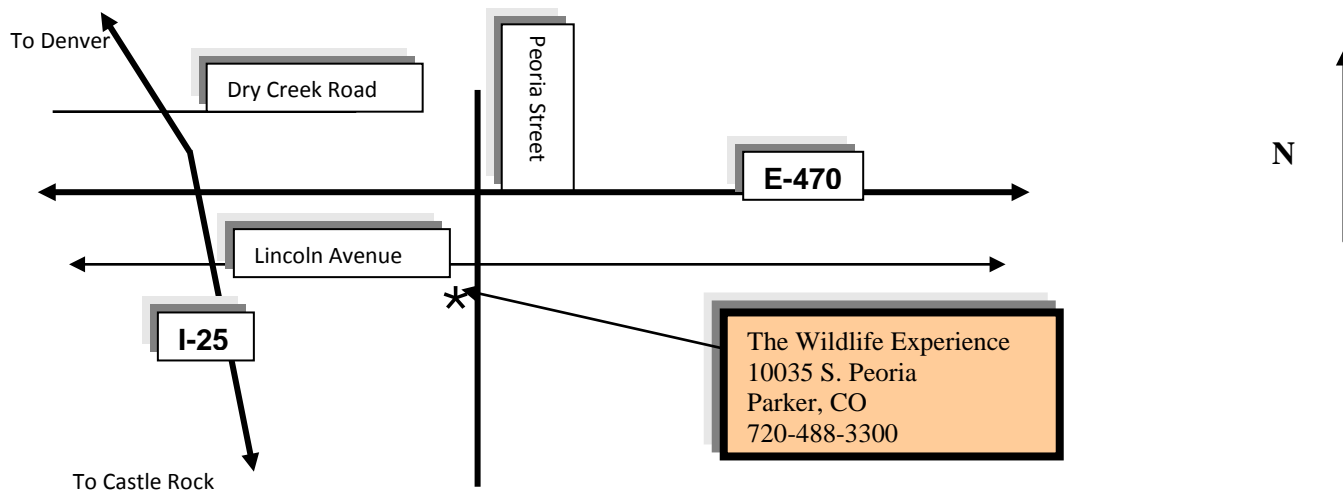
Wednesday, November 9, 2011 @ The Wildlife Experience, @ Lincoln and Peoria
